NEXT SUNDAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS: Jeremiah 17:5-8; 1 Corinthians 15:12, 16-20; Luke 6:17, 20-26.



I've been Pastor at Our Lady of Grace Parish for more than 5 1/2 years. On several occasions, the Parish Pastoral Council has suggested that we should have a parish mission to spark spiritual renewal in our community. But during my first term here in Scott Township, I've been preoccupied with the practical aspects of running a large suburban parish, such as balancing our operating budget, catching up on necessary capital improvements such as roofs and boilers, parking lots and building repairs, hiring and shaping some new staff and building up the parish organizations and leadership to poise our parish for the coming decade. Well, I believe we have accomplished much of this practical parish work so, I am confident, we can turn our attention to the most vital aspect of parish life: spiritual renewal.

On Pentecost Sunday and the week following, I have scheduled a Parish Mission for Our Lady of Grace, from May 23-27, 2010. A mission, or week of renewal, is a blessed time in a parish's life when we can reach out to those who have fallen away from the faith, or those who remain unchurched, or to practicing Catholics in need of a spiritual spark. To that end, I have invited Fr. James Wehner, the Rector and President of the Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus, Ohio to lead our parish mission. Fr. Wehner is originally a priest of the Diocese of Pittsburgh who was Rector of St. Paul Seminary here in Pittsburgh and pastor of nearby St. Thomas More Parish, before being appointed by Pope Benedict XVI as Rector in Columbus, Ohio. He visited Our Lady of Grace on two previous occasions, once with a group of seminarians, and he made a strong impression on many of our parishioners with his personal vigor, his dynamic preaching and his evangelical spirit. I am confident that Fr. James Wehner will do a great job of rekindling the fire of faith here at OLG come Pentecost as we near the close of The Year of the Priest.

Please mark your calendars for May 23-27 so that you will be a part of this week of spiritual renewal.
