**A Word from the PASTOR**



Last Sunday, we celebrated World Day of Prayer for Vocations, pausing to pray for those young men and women who are discerning God's call for their lives. Many of our second grade students are, again, making their First Holy Communion this weekend, encountering Jesus Christ in this most intimate of the seven sacraments. Their names are listed on the enclosed bulletin insert to commemorate this occasion. All of us, then, should be mindful of the merciful grace of God's love poured out for our sakes in the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ which is re-presented for us in the Eucharist.

Children can be very impressionable at important times like this in their lives; everything around them seems full of meaning and purpose. Please congratulate them on this wonderful sacramental moment in their tender lives. And use this opportunity to renew your own love and devotion for the body, blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ that we receive in the Blessed Sacrament.

Whether in elementary school, high school, college or in their adult working years, our young people need models of dedicated service if they are to be open to God's call for their lives. This week, I want to point to two members of our staff as vocational models who give of themselves to the Church selflessly for the good of the gospel.

Sister Grace Marie Herrle, C.S.J., our parish's Director of Social Services the past several years, is an outstanding example of a woman who gives of herself to the poor, the sick, the alienated, the shut-ins in and near our parish, as well as to other parishioners such as the Ladies of Charity or the many families grieving the loss of loved ones. She is always helping and praying for us. These days, she herself is mourning five relatives and friends she has lost over the past few weeks. This is a good time for you to let her know how much you appreciate her vocation as a Sister of Saint Joseph.

Rev. Dr. Lawrence Sutton, OLG's Deacon the past decade, is an accomplished and quiet man, who cares for our Church in the same intelligent and compassionate way that he cares for his wife and three sons, or serves the needs of troubled youth for the Commonwealth. Among our first communicants, were four children who participated in the new Sacramental Preparation Program for Autistic Children that our Deacon initiated, designed and monitored this past year for families seeking this help for their kids. With diocesan approval, Deacon Sutton brought the light of the gospel to these autistic children with the help of several OLG teenage catechists. Be sure to let him know how much we appreciate his initiative in finding innovative ways to catechize children with special needs in preparation for receiving Jesus Christ in communion.

Sr. Grace Marie Herrle, C.S.J., and Rev. Dr. Larry Sutton are wonderful models of dedicated service in the Church for our children and young people who might be discerning God's call.
