Today, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. We reverently recall the fundamental and mysterious truth of our Christian faith: our Lord has revealed Himself as three persons in one God—Father, Son and Holy Spirit. This mystery is so embedded in our Catholic faith and worship that sometimes we lose sight of this deep, fundamental belief and its meaning in our lives.

It took the Church 500 years to work out the fuller theological understanding of the Holy Trinity as foundational Christian dogma, though this truth was evident in Jesus' life and teaching as recorded in the New Testament. Several early Church councils were devoted to understanding the relationship between the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. By the end of the 5th century A.D., the Church settled on the authentic theological language to describe the Christian belief in three persons in one God, though it always remains a mystery of faith.

The mystery of the Trinity so far transcends creation and our reason that no analogy from the created order can adequately express it. In our Church's history, Christian thinkers have used metaphors such as a fire with its aspects of flame, heat and light, or the shamrock, the 3-leaf clover, to help us understand this obscure but essential truth. But in the human family, we have a glimpse of a community of love and life that suggests the Holy Trinity. Our human families are a semblance, a hint, an intimation of the Divine Family we call the Holy Trinity. Now, be clear of this: our human families are not the same as the ineffable Trinity—for nothing earthly can be the same as something heavenly. But our human families are similar to and suggest God's own existence as a community of love and life. In our families, both families of blood and families of faith, God calls us to live in a community of love and life as He Himself exists forever in a community of personal love and life we call the Holy Trinity.
