This week, I will be on retreat at Saint Emma's Monastery in Greensburg with my priests' prayer group. About 7-8 of us will pray, rest, read, converse and listen to the spiritual guidance of Fr. Thomas Acklin, OSB, of Saint Vincent Archabbey, who will direct our five-day retreat. You may recall that Fr. Acklin celebrated Mass and spoke at Our Lady of Grace Parish in Lent of 2006, discussing his two recently published books, The Unchanging Heart of the Priesthood and The Passion of the Lamb. Fr. We worked at two job sites. We began each day at 6:00 a.m. at the lake for Prayer and Liturgy of the Word with teen led dialogue. It was very inspiring. One of the Baptist churches fed us breakfast and dinner, which was followed with music and worship. Most teens slept on the way back to our dorms to get cleaned up and some free time before our evening meeting at 10:00 p.m. Driven with the desire to get the second home under roof before the weather changed, some volunteered to return to the work site early and stay late. This group of teens was the most open and accepting of each other that I have worked with in my entire life. They helped each other, their attitudes were outstanding, they worked together and played together and shared their faith with each other and with the adults. They were and are an inspiration to all of us.

Testimony: My first trip to Appalachia truly made a difference in my life. It changed my outlook on various views and made me realize that we all take so much for granted. When we first talked about going, I wanted to, but I was nervous. I had questions like, "Will I be able to do the tasks? Will I be able to keep my 'game face' if I saw horrible conditions?" However, after my first day on the job working, these questions were answered and I had no doubt that I would be able to do the work and we would accomplish our goal of building the decks, fixing the roof, and other tasks. The site I worked really made me realize how much my family and friends had. The trailer didn't have any utilities, no running water, electricity or heat/ac. Working on this trailer made me so appreciative for my life and everything I have. Fixing the houses and seeing how happy we could make people made me peaceful. This experience was also so touching because even though we might think we only made a small change, we made a huge and very important change to all the people's lives who we helped this week.
