This Sunday evening at 7:00 p.m., all high school students in our parish are invited to the initial Fall meeting of our Youth Ministry in the new Upper Room of the Church. With the retirement of Mrs. Judith Hill, OLG's Director of Youth Ministry for 25 years, our program is in transition. With the help of our high school students, I will personally take the lead for the next couple of months to schedule meetings, shape the calendar of events and plan for the future of Youth Ministry at Our Lady of Grace Parish. Eventually, I will hire a new director for the program.

I hope my personal involvement this Fall signals the importance I place on this ministry in our parish. Years ago, as a high school student growing up in Pittsburgh in the 1960s-1970s, a parish priest reached out to our group of city kids to form a vibrant and large CYO (Catholic Youth Organization) for neighborhoods in the East End that was a formative influence in many of our lives, mine included. With that experience in mind, as a priest and pastor I have always tried to strengthen existing youth programs or build a new one in the parishes I've served. Fortunately, for us, Judith Hill did a great job of sustaining and growing Youth Ministry at OLG these past 25 years, so we only have to build on the considerable work she accomplished with our high school students, not create a new program.

Fortunately, Judith and I talked alot about her work these past 5 years that I've been pastor at OLG and I tried to support her efforts with our young people. This past summer, I had the opportunity to spend a couple of days with our 50 students and adults in Tennessee on their Appalachian Mission Trip. I'm anxious to sustain and build on the exemplary work that Mrs. Hill has left as a ministerial legacy for our youth, our families and our parish.
