This past week, our new Parish Pastoral Council held its third quarterly meeting to elect officers, organize committees, discuss ongoing initiatives in the parish and consider future plans for Our Lady of Grace Parish. The Parish Pastoral Council consists of 12 members: Dr. Phil Boggio, Linda Cahill, Herman Dieckmann, Anne Fichter, Ann Korpiel, Dan McDyer, Mark Mox, Robert Musial, Dennis Stover, Dr. Richard Vernino, Sue Zuk, and Gary Zyra.

The OLG Parish Pastoral Council, an advisory body to the pastor, is a hybrid that will do both short-range projects and long-range planning. With that in mind, the Council recently elected its leadership: Dr. Philip Boggio is the Chairman, and Dr. Richard Vernino is the Vice-Chairman/Secretary.

After considerable discussion the past two meetings, the Parish Pastoral Council will have five standing committees based on the nature and ministry of parish life: Education, Evangelization, Liturgy, Property Planning and Fundraising, and Vocations. While the other four committees are self-explanatory, Evangelization is a new and broad committee that includes a number of parish efforts reaching out to build up parish life. Its operation and leadership is still being discussed as of this writing. Sue Zuk will head the Education Committee. Dr. Richard Vernino will head the Liturgy Committee. Dennis Stover will head the Property, Planning and Fundraising Committee, and Herman Dieckmann will head the Vocations Committee.

Among the short-term projects of the Parish Pastoral Council are a census, a parish mission and a directory of services and organizations. The long-term plans include a capital campaign for major improvements and an evangelization effort to bring back those who have drifted away from the Church as well as inviting the unchurched to our faith. Members of the Council will be seeking help for these projects and planning. Please consider volunteering your help in the months to come.
